In September of 2021 our dear Aunt Phyllis was diagnosed with terminal cancer and advised that she wouldn't be able to return home. After spending two days at the hospital, she was transferred to Rotary Hospice Stratford Perth where she would spend her final days.

Aunt Phyllis believed that the hospice would be a beautiful peaceful place. From the moment she arrived, she expressed how nice everything was. Lying in a comfortable bed, while enjoying the fireplace and the birds at the window she said it "was like a little piece of heaven."

The staff and volunteers are truly amazing. The rooms are bright, cheery, homey and spacious. The beautiful handmade quilts that adorn each bed add an extra special warmth and feel to the room and the atmosphere. One of the most touching moments was the honour guard formed by the staff and volunteers and the lighting and placing of the candle as the final farewell.

On behalf of our entire family, words cannot express how grateful we are for the care and compassion that Aunt Phyllis received in her final days from everyone at Rotary Hospice.

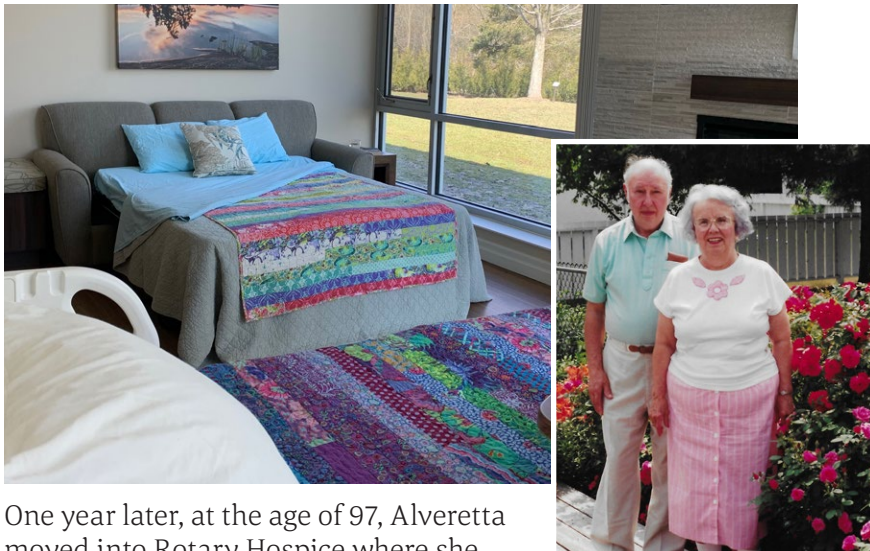
Remembering our neighbours
Jack & Alveretta Henderson

Cared for like family

Jack and Alveretta would often say they had no close family, but that neighbours and friends were their family. As world travellers and retired teachers, time spent with them always included an interesting story from their past. The care team at Rotary Hospice were recipients of those stories too.

Together for over 60 years of marriage, Jack and Alveretta supported each other through years of cancer, back injuries, and more.

Determined to remain on Jack's family farm after retiring from their teaching careers, they operated a Bed & Breakfast on the property for 35 years. However, when Jack was diagnosed with terminal cancer, they both realized caring for him at home was more than they could manage. With much trepidation they sought further care and were introduced to Rotary Hospice. Jack was very content at the hospice knowing his and Alveretta's needs were addressed. When Alveretta decided to stay overnight with her husband, we knew they felt the love and care of the hospice staff.



One year later, at the age of 97, Alveretta moved into Rotary Hospice where she spent her final days. She too appreciated the kindness, care and love she was given by the staff. Covid restricted indoor visits so staff graciously rolled Alveretta's bed outdoors, allowing her to visit with the many friends and neighbours wishing to say their goodbyes. Her insistence of a sizable donation to Rotary Hospice indicated her appreciation for the many merits of hospice.

As neighbours, Jack and Alveretta thought of us as family. It comforts us to know that the team at Rotary Hospice cared for them like family too.
